FOREWORD

BECAUSE OF THE INCREASING INTEREST in the field of International Law and Relations, it is evident that classification in this area will not only become a matter of greater and greater concern to the libraries that are already involved but will become a matter of importance to additional libraries which will be faced with the necessity of acquiring such materials.

Kurt Schwerin's original Classification which he developed at the University of Virginia Law Library, has been welcomed as a scheme which seeks a middle ground between the inadequate schedule of the Dewey Decimal Classification and the close classification of the Library of Congress. As Mr. Schwerin's Preface indicates, his new edition is based, among other things, upon his experience in the Northwestern University Law School Library both as Assistant Librarian and Head of the Foreign and International Law Sections. The development of these fields, for which he has had the major responsibility, has offered him an opportunity to apply his original Classification to a growing collection and to make suitable adaptations and expansions. It is hoped that Mr. Schwerin's experience as reflected in the new edition will be of substantial assistance to many other persons struggling with the same problems.

This new edition of the Classification is one in a group of publications by members of the Northwestern University Law School Library staff. It is in line with the policy to contribute, whenever practicable, to the field of librarianship as a whole which the Library has been actively pursuing for a long time.

Kurt Schwerin has made such a substantial contribution to the work of the Northwestern University Law School Library staff, of which he has been a member since 1948, that this Foreword would not be complete without an expression of appreciation on behalf of the Law School and from his colleagues in the Library.

For Nearly twelve years this Classification has been in use in the University of Virginia Law Library, and ten years ago it was also adopted for the collection of International Law and Relations in the Elbert H. Gary Library of the Northwestern University School of Law. It has since been adopted for other smaller collections. Both at the University of Virginia and at Northwestern University, the Classification in general has proved workable.

During the practical application of the Classification at Northwestern, certain suggestions offered by reviewers and critics and the few revisions adopted by the University of Virginia were carefully examined, and as a result, a number of changes have been made which are pointed out below. Specifically, such changes resulted from an examination of the use of multiple notations for a particular subject and from investigation of the advisability of a breakdown and an expansion of certain classification numbers.

Where various approaches to one particular subject made it necessary, multiple notations have been retained. In some instances it was found possible to reduce the number of such notations by increasing the cross-references. In all cases, however, where the use of multiple notations had to be clarified, a definite place for a specific topic has been indicated in the Index. A breakdown of notations became advisable in certain cases where the classification number comprised a group of related topics. In nearly all such cases, the breakdown has been accomplished by adding decimals to the original classification number. The following example will explain both the changes in the multiple notations and the expansion of classification numbers.

In the first edition of the Classification, materials on Atomic power, e.g., were under 513 classed with related materials on Land warfare and under 54 with Aerial warfare. In the new edition, 513 has been broken down, and a new notation, 5132, has been adopted for Atomic energy together with Nuclear weapons. The number 54 no longer covers this subject but has a cross reference to 5132. On the other hand, the notations under 514 (Prohibited instruments and methods of warfare) and under 661 (International control and Peaceful use) have been retained and are properly listed in the Index.

Other changes and additions were made necessary by political developments and by the introduction of new concepts since the publication of the first edition. New notations were also introduced for a number of special topics which had not been incorporated in the original scheme. Additional classification numbers have been added for the Organization of American States.

For the European regional organizations, the notations (681 for non-official and 81 for official publications) follow the notations for the United Nations. As in the case of the specialized agencies of the United Nations (6754 and 79), a mixed notation has been introduced which shows on the third line the initials of the organization. The Glossary of Abbreviations for the specialized agencies of the United Nations has been retained under 79. A Glossary of Symbols for the European regional organizations has been incorporated in the Classification under 81. For both the specialized agencies of the United Nations and the regional organizations a breakdown has been introduced for optional use which will facilitate the classification of materials dealing with or emanating from individual organs of the organization.

Special consideration has been given to the expansion of the notations for the League of Nations and the United Nations. For this purpose, various special classification schemes have been examined, among others, the classification used by the United Nations Library in New York, by the Library of the Peace Palace in The Hague, and by Columbia University Law Library.

The classification numbers for the individual organs of the League and the United Nations and for their official records, resolutions, rules of procedure, etc., have been retained or have been revised and expanded. For the mass of miscellaneous publications issued by the Secretariat, the Roman numerals of the sales series of the two organizations are utilized as a subject classification. This makes it possible to group all related subject materials together even if they do not have a sales number or a document symbol. A subject breakdown has also been provided for the non-official publications of the League and the United Nations.

To describe more accurately the materials included in Sections I and II, their titles have been changed to "Treatises and other Non-documentary Materials on International Law" and "Treatises and other Non-documentary Materials on International Relations" respectively. Because Private international law (Conflict of laws) is in general classed with domestic law, the Outline given in Appendix III of the first edition has been dropped. Appendices I and II have been retained and enlarged.

General introductory information on the Classification is included in the Foreword and Preface to the first edition, both of which are reprinted in full. They should be consulted by everyone using the scheme.

Numerous colleagues have seen the revision of this Classification in various stages of preparation and have assisted me with their advice. I want to thank especially Mrs. Florence Ferner Zagayko, International Law Librarian at Columbia University, for suggesting the subject breakdown for the United Nations and League of Nations materials. Dr. Werner B. Ellinger, Senior Subject Cataloger (Law), Library of Congress, provided valuable advice on various aspects of the Classification and on a number of specific notations. Mr. Jorgen K. Nielsen, Chief of the Catalogue Section, United Nations Library, New York, made helpful comments on the classification of United Nations materials in general, Dr. Bartholomeus Landheer, Director-Librarian of the Library of the Palace of Peace. The Hague, sent me the classification scheme of his library. Mr. John Russell Mason, Librarian, George Washington University, lent me the classification scheme for United Nations publications originally prepared by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace Library, and Miss Marietta Daniels, Associate Librarian, Columbus Memorial Library, Pan American Union, sent me a copy of her provisional Documents Classification for the Organization of American States. Other helpful advice was provided by Mr. Earl C. Borgeson, Librarian, Miss Margaret M. Moody, Head of the Catalog Department, both of Harvard Law Library, and Mr. Lee Ash, Editor, Library Journal, formerly Librarian, Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. The Law Library of the University of Virginia has kept me informed on changes in its classification.

With particular gratitude, I acknowledge the assistance of the head catalogers of the Northwestern University Law Library, Miss Helen McLaury, her successor, Mrs. Herta Prager, and the present Head of the Catalog Department, Mr. Adolfs Sprudzs. Mr. Sprudzs especially was of invaluable help in examining with critical and analytical understanding all aspects of the Classification, in detecting inadequacies and inconsistencies and in checking and re-checking the notations and the Index.

The University of Virginia Law Library, as the owner of the copyright of the first edition, kindly gave its permission for a change in the copyright of the new edition.

FOREWORD

to the First Edition

THERE HAS LONG BEEN A NEED for an adequate and practical classification scheme for International law and Relations. The Dewey Decimal classification section 341 on International law is undeveloped and entirely inadequate for a library of any size, and although it will be expanded in the forthcoming edition, it still will not be designed to fit the needs of a university or specialized collection. The Library of Congress section on international law and relations, designated by the letters JX, is too cumbersome and detailed even for most such special collections. Large libraries have used it, however, in preference to Dewey, even when the rest of the library is classified by Dewey. Such is the case at Columbia University. Attempts have been made here to simplify it, but even so, some numbers are still so long and complicated that readers cannot find the books readily, especially in the section on relations between two countries, where numbers and letters are strung out in a row of eight to ten digits. The section for collections of documents is also confusing.

Miss Basset's Outline was the first publication of an international law classification scheme since the Library of Congress scheme, and we are glad to see the University of Virginia Law Library take the leading step in adapting this outline into a workable classification, because it is so logical and at the same time practical. Libraries in a position to use it are fortunate, and it is possible that, with the increased interest in international affairs since the war, more libraries will find that they can use it to advantage.

to the First Edition

ELSIE BASSET INCLUDED in her Cataloging Manual for Law Libraries1 an "Outline of Topic Headings for Books on International Law and Relations, in Classified Form." A two-figure system of numbers is attached to the Outline for possible use as a classification.

When the reorganization of the University of Virginia Law Library was begun in 19422 the Basset scheme was adopted as classification without any change. It has been used since then and proved in general very workable. Miss Basset's Outline was naturally intended only for a small collection and would have to be expanded for a collection of any size. This was, for certain sections, recognized with the growth of the Library. It became imperative when the extensive John Bassett Moore Collection of International Law was given to this Library in 1946.

In expanding the Basset Outline the basic two-figure scheme has been transformed into a decimal system. Numerous notations have been broken down, certain notations have been changed, and others added. The Basset Outline includes each topic in any group of headings where it logically belonged with related topics. For our classification, generally one place has been selected for the notation. In some instances when various approaches to one particular subject require it, multiple notations have been established. Thus, 513 is the class number for Atomic bomb as an instrument of land warfare, including discussions of methods and use, while 54 is used for discussions of the Atomic bomb in aerial warfare. 514 classes the Atomic bomb with other "Prohibited instruments and methods of warfare," while International control of Atomic energy will be classed in 661 and thus grouped with International cooperation and International (collective) security with which it is logically related. For the benefit of the classifier cross references have been provided for related topics.

The division of the Outline into three main sections has been retained:

- 1. Treatises on international law, 2. Treatises on international relations,
- 3. Collections of reports and documents. Having a separate section for

documents and providing a separate notation of claims in that section may prove practical in many specialized libraries.

In the foreign relations section (63, 64), in the documents section (83, 84, 87, 88, 95), and in class 79 (Specialized agencies of United nations) the mixed notation has been retained or newly introduced in preference to the pure notation by figures in the other sections. In class 79 the third line shows the official initials of the agency. A Glossary of abbreviations for this section has been included in the classification. The mixed notation should prove helpful to readers in an open shelf library which often is adopted for international law collections.

In the event that a work deals with the foreign relations between two countries, several procedures of classing might be selected. Miss Basset makes the following suggestions in her Outline (p. 220):

If [the book] is an official publication, it might be classed with the country issuing it. Since both countries in question are likely to publish works on the same subject matter, however, the publications would, according to this policy, be separated on the shelves. In order to keep together all material on one subject, the rule may be adopted of putting it all under the country which comes first alphabetically. That is, all works dealing with relations between, e.g., Germany and Italy would be classed with Germany. Exception: when the United States is one of the countries concerned, Library of Congress classes with the United States."

Woodrow Wilson Library of the Woodrow Wilson Foundation, New York, which is recataloging its collection, intends to put material on relations between two countries with the smaller country in order to avoid accumulations under the big countries. This seems advisable if the collection is not too large, and if a list is available for decisions in doubtful cases. University of Virginia Law Library adopted in 1942 a scheme which classes the material with the first country appearing on the title-page, or in cases of official publications, with the issuing country. In doubtful cases the book is classed with the country whose point of view it represents. All these schemes are more or less arbitrary; they are listed here to show the classifier various possibilities of approach.

A list of country abbreviations will be found in Appendix II. Examples of the classification are added to several of the notations. In addition, a list of examples with complete call-numbers is given in Appendix I. Private international law (Conflict of laws) is not included in this classification. We give, however, in Appendix III a simple classification for that topic which is based, with slight changes, on Appendix 6 (p. 249) in Miss Basset's Manual.

PREFACE TO THE FIRST EDITION

In expanding the Basset Outlines we had to take into consideration that it would be unadvisable and, in view of our limited staff, nearly impossible, to discard completely the "Int"-scheme as it was used before in the University of Virginia Law Library. It should be pointed out that part of the reclassification of the collection went hand in hand with the expansion of the original classification scheme. We hope the practical application might have been of benefit to the development of our expansion.

The undersigned wants to thank Miss Elsie Basset for her encouragement in the finishing and publishing of this classification. Whatever credit is due to the scheme should go to her as the author of the original Outline. Thankful acknowledgments go to numerous colleagues who helped with their advice. Miss Florence K. Ferner who wrote the Foreword, was untiring in making valuable suggestions. Mrs. Esther P. Potter, Director, and Miss Sarah Catherine France, Associate Editor, Dewey Decimal Classification, Library of Congress, made constructive comments and put a copy of the tentative scheme of the forthcoming revision of the Dewey International Law Section at our disposal. Woodrow Wilson Memorial Library, New York City, sent us useful information. Nearly all notations have been discussed with Mrs. Margaret Van Cise Shoemaker. Cataloger, University of Virginia Law Library. Her comments were most helpful throughout the progress of the whole work, and she also compiled and checked the Index. Miss Frances Farmer, Law Librarian, University of Virginia, put the technical facilities of the Library at the disposal of the Catalog Department and gave to the project her full support. Columbia University Libraries, as the owner of the copyright of Miss Basset's Manual, kindly gave its permission to copyright our revision.
